## **Organization Background (SABAWON)**

SABAWON stands for Social Action Bureau for Assistance in Welfare and Organizational Networking. It is a civil society organization created in September 1994, and is registered with the Government of Pakistan under the Societies Act of 1860. It is also registered with the Ministry of SAFRAN and with the Government of Islamic Republic of Afghanistan.

SABAWON is working to form a society which is attributed as free from all kind of discrimination and striving to provide an enabling environment to the under resourced vulnerable communities for ensuring sustainable livelihood. Motivated by our concern for the country's poverty, affecting mostly women and children, SABAWON's mission is to provide access to the primary education, Primary health, water and Sanitation, hygiene Promotion (WASH) and promote development through Poverty Alleviation in all Social sectors through dynamic partnerships that builds the local capacity in efficient and measurable ways:

- We believe in Partnership;
- We together find Solutions;
- We strive for Change; and
- We make a Difference.

Since its inception, SABAWON remained associated with some leading national and international humanitarian organizations. SABAWON has worked with UNICEF, Care International (US based INGO), Abt. Associates Inc. /USAID, Department for International Development (DfID) Government of United Kingdom, DAI/USAID, Walthungerhilfe (German Agro Action, German based INGO), National Education Foundation (NEF) funded by the NORAD/Government of Pakistan. Rural Support Program Network (RSPN), Clean Drinking Water for All (CDWA) Federal Ministry of Environment Islamabad, Federal Ministry of Health Islamabad, the European Commission, Save the Children UK and Asian Development Bank.

Currently SABAWON is working as implementing partner with the Oxfam GB (a UK based INGO), Concern World Wide (CWW), (a UK based INGO), Global Alliance for Vaccine Immunization (GAVI) funded by the UNICEF and World Health Organization (WHO) Communications for Effective Social Services Delivery (CESSD) funded by Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA), Water Aid (a UK based International organization), Concern Worldwide, British Council Pakistan, and Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund (PPAF) funded by the World Bank and United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and the World Bank.

These projects includes regular development programs as well as response to the natural disasters and complex emergency situations, which includes Provision of Community Physical Infrastructure, Health & Hygiene Education, Water & Environmental Sanitation (Software & Hardware), Agricultural Drought Mitigation through Integrated Approach, Development of Small Dams for Irrigation and introducing Modern Agricultural Technologies in far flung rural areas of Pakistan for increased yield and better production eventually resulting in national development of Pakistan.

SABAWON has an inspiring working history, from the very beginning; SABAWON successfully implemented the projects funded by the UNICEF for a period of more than six years in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Punjab, and in selected areas of Northern Pakistan, which were affected by the year 2005 massive earthquake. The projects were based on provision of safe drinking water and basic sanitation facilities to the earthquake affected displaced

people resided in Maira Camp District Shangla North West Pakistan and improvement of water and sanitation facilities in refugee affected areas of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province Pakistan, moreover SABAWON worked on the European Commission funded Women Political Participation Project in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Punjab.

SABAWON is one among the few national humanitarian organizations in Pakistan who have a good track record of working all over the country including FATA and Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) implementing different projects. SABAWON has conducted a national level 3<sup>rd</sup> party validation and performance assessment and evaluation project of water filtration plants installed under Clean Drinking Water for All initiative for MOE/MOI-GoP and Pakistan Safe Drinking Water and Hygiene Promotion Project (PSDW - HPP) funded by US AID. The project was implemented in all four provinces of Pakistan including Punjab, KPK, Baluchistan, Sindh and AJK. Besides visiting the far flung areas nationwide, SABAWON performed assessment in 32 Tehsils within 6 districts of Sindh province which are Sakkur, Larkana, Jamshora, Dadu, Khairpur and Thatta. The southern districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province are known as the most vulnerable areas of the country due to low literacy rate, limited income opportunities and acute shortage of safe drinking water and sanitation facilities. Since its inception, SABAWON plays a key role in extending humanitarian activities in Southern districts/FRs and FATA, including Dera Ismail Khan, Bannu, Karak, Kohat Hangu, Lakki Marwat, Mohmand, Khyber and Orakzai Agency.

SABAWON has worked/working with Ministry of Women Development and Agha Khan University on TAWANA Pakistan Project, NCHD/GOP, OXFAM-GB, Plan International, Concern World Wide (CWW)OFDA-funds, PAAF (world bank and USDA funding), aimed for improving health/Nutrition, education (formal and non-formal), WASH, Livelihood, community physical infrastructure, Drought mitigation and preparedness, modern agriculture and water shed management, for rural communities, IDPS, flood affected and Government Girls/Boys Primary Schools. Presently SABAWON is working in District D I Khan and Kohat in partnership With PPAF/WB/USDA (funding) since 2005, and OXFAM-GB and CWW-OFDA on WASH and livelihood, and has completed a number of successful projects. Currently SABAWON has negotiated signed a partnership agreement with PPAF (KFW/GTZ funding) and is going to start community based renewable energy project in District Lakki Marwat and Bannu. Earlier SABAWON has implemented a successful Water and Environmental Sanitation Project in District Hangu in partnership with UNICEF Pakistan for 5 years. A detail description of these projects is available on pages 8, 9 and 10 of this profile.

SABWON extends humanitarian support to extremely marginalize and crisis ridden communities of Federally Administered Tribal Areas (FATA) bordering Afghanistan with Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province in North West Pakistan. Despite political challenges and security risks, SABAWON currently works with Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund on a development project in South Waziristan Agency. The project was designed to assist the poor returnees in restoration of their livelihood. The project has 3 components including Social Mobilization / Human and institutional Development (HID) Community Infrastructure and Livelihood Enhancement and Protection (LEP). SABAWON has received No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the FATA Disaster Management Authority with regular renewal and is registered with FATA Social Welfare Department housed in Peshawar.

SABAWON provides quality water supply, basic safe sanitation and hygiene education services to more than 10,000 IDPs residing in New Durrani Camp Sadda, Kurram agency with financial support and technical guidance of UNICEF Peshawar.

SABAWON has a paramount record of accomplishments for serving the crisis ridden poor communities in District Kohat. SABAWON initiated the earlier humanitarian activities in District Kohat with support of the Federal Ministry of Women Development Islamabad and Agha Khan University Karachi for a School Nutrition Program named Tawana Pakistan Project, Funded through Pakistan Bait-ul-Mal. The project aimed to introduce a nutritional fresh food program available in government Girls primary schools for contributing in physical and mental development of school going girls' children.

SABAWON in partnership with OXFAM-GB and Concern World Wide-UK (INGOs) extended timely services to the people of **District Kohat** during the moment of distress caused by heavy influx of IDPs from nearby situated tribal areas, and then in the 2010 floods on Emergency basis. The support further extended in relief and rehabilitation as well.

SABAWON currently implements a total sanitation project in all villages of selected 3 union councils Ali Zai, Muhammad Zai and Urban VI in District Kohat with financial support of UNICEF Pakistan. The project has been designed to provide benefit in access to safe drinking water, basic sanitation facilities and awareness rising on hygiene promotion. The proposed project focuses on total sanitation technique, which is a combination of both CLTS and Sanitation Marketing. The project is taking quality approach to create demand for sanitation and to use marketing technique to improve the supply of sanitation related products and services. The project has been fully in line with Pakistan Approach towards Total Sanitation (PATS) and is implemented in close consultation with UNICEF with guidance acquired from national and international experts on sanitation.

Adhering to its mandate of serving the vulnerable communities, SABAWON extended timely support to the natural and manmade disasters affected residents of **District Swat** by working on a project "Rehabilitation of flood damaged water and sanitation systems and improved service delivery in Swat District". The project was initiated jointly with Mercy Corps funded by the European Commission. The overall objective of the project is improving water and sanitation services to the 2010 flood affected communities in District Swat through infrastructure rehabilitation, improved delivery mechanisms, and enhanced community capacity and awareness on hygiene, sanitation and system management.

SABAWON worked on the Interact World Pakistan (IWP) Project through Pakistan National AIDS Consortium (European Commission Funded),

SABAWON also worked on Asian Development Bank funded Community Model Schools and Social Resettlement Plans for National Highway Authority/Roads Projects, UNDP funded Women Councilors Training Project (W3P) in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Component Sharing Model (OPP/LPP Replication) with Town Municipal Administration (TMA) of Town -I and IV, Peshawar in partnership with UNICEF and TMA funds, installing sewer, and Child Rights/Protection with UNICEF and Save the Children UK in few Districts of KP and Khyber Agency.

2014 opens new avenues for SABAWON as SABAWON has recently initiated PACE-PD: Poverty Alleviation through Community Empowerment and Participatory Development Project in District Bhakkar Punjab Pakistan. The community development project focuses on 21,220 rural households to promote an inclusive and empowered society in Pakistan for poverty alleviation and for benefiting populations out of reach of mainstream services and

resources and excluded from policy making processes. The specific objective of the action is to restore and strengthen resilience of communities through social mobilization and community empowerment enabling them to participate in the development process.

SABAWON works on development projects in the areas of primary health, primary education, WASH, Poverty Alleviation, food security, capacity building, Child Rights/Child Protection, violence against women, water sanitation and hygiene, enterprise development and possess rich experience and valuable knowledge in the areas of social development, decentralized governance, capacity development, poverty alleviation and building public private partnerships for achieving the common objectives.

SABAWON considers intervention in these sectors essential to reduce poverty and to ensure gender equity based sustainable social development. It has all the plans to scale up its operation throughout Pakistan and the entire Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) region as well, in the mentioned sectors. SABAWON is also contributed in strengthening of the Local Government System at district level and intermittently provide capacity development support to the sub district municipal service delivery organizations.

SABAWON understands that close linkages exist between disasters and development as the severity of natural disasters could jeopardize the strenuous efforts of government towards human development. In district Charsadda "Community Based Disaster Risk Management Project" has recently been concluded. The project was implemented in 21 Union Councils of Charsadda encompassing awareness raising at community level on disaster risk management and its sub themes in partnership with Concern Worldwide funded by OFDA US AID. The project objective was improving the disaster risk management capacities and strategies of poor and vulnerable populations and other key stakeholders in Charsadda districts of Pakistan through sustainable preparedness and increased institutional capacity. SABAWON currently implements "Disaster Risk Management" Project in 2 Union Councils of Dera Ismail Khan in partnership with Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund (PPAF).

While most of the development projects are rural in focus and commonly aligned with community development objectives, SABAWON made earnest efforts to adhere to the participatory approaches and the undertaken activities largely revolve around capacity development and awareness rising of the community organizations considering the pertinent humanitarian social and developmental issues. For ensuring maximum participation of the community members in development activities, the Local Government Institutions, Parent Teacher Associations, Community Based and Village Based Organizations are formed and involved in the consultative process.

SABAWON understands particular significance is the best practices and ideas that emerge from the community itself. In order to understand the communities' approaches and behavior, SBAWON strongly emphasize on conducting community base line surveys and Poverty bench marking, which remains an integral part of most of our projects. Surveys provide an excellent way of checking the pulse of the community and obtaining specific and current information from a cross section of residents in timely manners.

Most of our earlier conducted surveys were based on measuring behavior and population characteristics, making citizens more aware of community related issues and their effects and informing people about existing, newly introduced and planned public services. SABAWON possess years' long experience in programming and organizing different community based surveys primarily related to WASH and health sector services across the country.

The organization has a Coordination Office based in Peshawar with a number of regional offices spread over Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, FATA, Punjab and AJK. Staff strength of the organization is 150, of which 30% are women.

Core values of SABAWON, which are reflected in its institutional work, include building long-term partnerships with the community, finding solutions collectively, bringing real change at the grassroots level and making sustainable impacts in the field.

SABAWON has proven capacity of implementing both regular & emergency projects. The SABAWON moral code of valuing the local knowledge & indigenous initiatives make it the successful contributor to the development sector. SABAWON believes that every developmental project is meant for the grass root level and being the sector player SABAWON has rich experience of working with the poor rural, urban and semi urban communities for the successful implementation of any project based on any development sector theme.
